### **David Coil Graduates from University of Missouri's Executive MBA Program**

COLUMBIA, MO (May 9, 2014) — David R. Coil, project manager at Coil Construction, is one of 19 students who will be graduating in the inaugural class of the University of Missouri Robert J. Trulaske, Sr. College of Business' executive MBA program (execMBA) on May 10th.

The execMBA program is a 21-month program with a hybrid of online and face-to-face classes. The program is designed for students, such as Coil, who continue to work in professional positions while pursuing their degree to build skills that increase self- and global-awareness, develop strategic risk taking and heighten influence.

"My experience in the execMBA program allows me to bring more structure and value to Coil Construction," David Coil said. "I now view projects from a client's perspective, beyond that of a builder, and incorporate managerial and leadership skills."

Based on the core curriculum of the college's full-time MBA program, the new degree offered Coil the opportunity to work with a diverse group of peers and further develop real-world skills.

"We view our clients' buildings as investments, performing at all functional, economic and financial levels. Buildings are supposed to work for you, not the other way around. It takes more than traditional construction knowledge to serve as a builder for the next generation of business," Coil said.

Coil received the designation of LEED Green Associate by the Green Building Certification Institute (GBCI) in 2010. The certification, which required completion of an education program on green building principles, indicates basic knowledge of green design, construction and operations.
