



OUR RESPONSE TO THE COVID-19 OUTBREAK

During these unprecedented times, Coil Construction is working to make sure our team stays safe and healthy as we build a better community. Our goal is to protect our employees and serve our clients while still keeping the economy moving forward. For the past 45 years, we've been committed to building a better community – and that commitment remains unwavering in these challenging times.

Coil continues to follow the latest on the COVID-19 outbreak and is taking proactive measures to protect the health and safety of its team and the communities we serve. Coil is following all city, county and state guidelines for a safe and healthy workplace environment.

Coil has implemented the following measures to help prevent the exposure and spread of COVID-19 and to keep our team stay safe and healthy.

OFFICE POLICIES:

- All employees are asked to protect themselves: In doing so, they also protect others they may have contact with.
- Office access: Beginning March 23, Coil restricted access to the office to employees only and maintains less than 10 people in the office at once. In addition, daily sanitization of office surfaces has been implemented.
- Meetings: Coil has limited internal meetings to no more than 5 employees at a time. In addition, no in-person meetings will be held with external parties.
- Work from home procedures: The Coil office remains open at this time. The decision to work from home is left to the discretion of each employee.

JOB SITE POLICIES:

- Job Site Safety Plan: Coil is submitting a COVID-19 safety plan along with any building permit applications.
- COVID-19 Checklist: Coil superintendents use this checklist to document that their job sites are abiding by CDC and local health authority guidelines.
- Daily Sign-in Sheet: All subcontractors are maintaining a list of workers who are on site and submitting that list to Coil. This will be used in the event a COVID-19 case appears on our job site. This documentation will be used to assist local health authorities with a contact investigation.
- COVID-19 Project Signs: Signage for COVID Guidelines for Contractors will be posted at Coil's most visible sites around Columbia. This will notify the public that Coil is implementing changes that may not be visible to the public.
- COVID-19 Basic Infection Prevention Measures: Additional signage will be posted on Coil's job sites. Basic measures include handwashing stations, daily sanitization of surfaces, limiting the number of workers within a work zone and a requirement that 6 feet of distance be maintained between workers.
